About Us

At our social welfare corporation, we call the care staff who support the lives of elderly people who require nursing care "Life Mates."

A "Life Mate" is a companion who lives with elderly people who require nursing care.

Since 2004, we have been proposing a system to introduce Filipino care workers to the Cabinet Office, and currently 18 foreign staff members from five countries - the Philippines, Vietnam, Nepal, Myanmar, and Indonesia - are working here.

Of these, four are care workers under the EPA (Environmental and Social Security Agreement), two are care workers under the study abroad program, and one is qualified to take the national care worker examination.

In addition, all of the people who came to Japan under the TITP (Technical Intern Training Program) or SSW1 (Specified Skilled Worker) hope to obtain national certification as a care worker.

Can you ride a bicycle?

Our facility in Sodegaura City was established in 1987. Based on a 384-bed general hospital, we provide services that combine medical care and nursing care.

The facility has a capacity of 100 people, and also has a day service center that can accommodate 45 people.

There are 82 staff members, including administrative staff and nurses. The average length of service of foreign staff is 6 years. The oldest staff member is from the Philippines, has worked there for 16 years, and has applied for permanent residency in Japan.

The entire corporation supports the pass rate of the National Certified Care Worker Examination, and the pass rate of foreign staff is high at 74.11%, and it has attracted attention as the first foreign staff member to pass in Chiba Prefecture.

Recruiting candidates for care workers

The duties are the same as for care workers. There are four shifts for care workers.

Early shift 7:30-16:30 (early shift allowance provided)

Day shift 8:30-17:30

Late shift 10:30-19:30 (late shift allowance provided)

Night shift 16:30-21:30 (night shift allowance provided)

The duties include assisting with daily life such as transfers, movement, eating, excretion, and bathing.

Senior Filipino staff can provide guidance and support in Tagalog or English regarding Japanese language skills.

The training support department, led by the facility director who is also a teacher at the care worker training facility, will support preparation for the national care worker exam. You can also use the company's preferential treatment system.

Study hours are set based on the progress of work and the level of understanding of Japanese.

The EPA Training Manager is a JPEPA 4th Badge Visitor (passed the national exam and is currently applying for permanent residency).

The director of the facility also serves as a lecturer at a care worker training facility, so you can be assured of academic support.

Currently, foreign staff from the Philippines, Vietnam, Indonesia, and Myanmar who are taking the TITP (Technical Intern Training Program) or SSW1 (Specified Skilled Worker)

exams are striving to pass the care worker exam.
